More than 300 residents from Fairfield St. James attended the Senior Information Fair hosted by Suffolk County Legislator Rob Trotta.

(Smithtown, NY)... At the request of the Fairfield St. James Civic Association, Suffolk County Legislator Robert Trotta recently hosted a Senior Information Fair for its residents. Town and county government offices, as well as other agencies provided information about the programs and services they offer for seniors. The Suffolk County Sheriff's Department issued Senior Emergency ID Cards and offered information about their Project Lifesaver and Yellow Dot Programs. Residents also had their blood pressure checked by a registered nurse from St. Catherine of Sienna Medical Center and cholesterol tested by nurses from Stony brook University Hospital. More than 300 people attended the event.
