### **Suffolk County Legislator Rob Trotta and Officials Congratulate a Trio of Eagle Scouts from St. James Boy Scout Troop 301**

(Smithtown, NY)...Suffolk County Legislator Robert Trotta (R-Fort Salonga, NY) and other local officials, as well as a representative from the St. James Fire Department, Fourth Police Precinct, and members of the American Legion came out to salute Boy Scout Troop 301's newest Eagle Scouts.

The American Legion Hall in St. James was the beneficiary of two of the scouts' Community Service Projects. Grant Herrmann replaced the old front door with a new efficient and attractive fiberglass door and glass side panels. He framed the door so that it creates a weathertight barrier for the building. Michael Fabrizio removed an old shed and prepared the ground for the installation and building of a new wooden one. He painted it and caulked the windows, as well as adding a gravel base under and around the shed.

For his Eagle Scout Project, Gregory Rosasco cleared out and constructed a therapeutic walking path on the grounds of Family Residences and Essential Enterprises (FREE) Day Program in East Setauket. He also made the trail wheelchair accessible and built a bench for a resting stop on the path, as well as adding a six foot lattice trellis to hide a dumpster.

“This is a tremendous honor to be bestowed on these young men while they are still in their teens.
