
COVID-19 Surveillance in Wastewater at Suffolk County Sewage Treatment Plants (STP)



- Current Trends at the County's Large/Regional STPs:
 - Bergen Point Substantial Decrease
 - Selden Substantial Decrease

Note: STP categorization is determine by number of properties served. Large STPs serve over 6,000 properties.

- At our larger/regional STPs, virus levels have decreased at Bergen Point and Selden. At our smaller/local STPs, virus levels have decreased at Port Jefferson, Riverhead, Parkland, SUNY Stony Brook, and Northport. Viral levels have increased at Twelve Pines and Woodside.
- This is a collaborative project between Suffolk County Department of Health, New York State Department of Health and the Wastewater Surveillance Network. We're working together to monitor the presence of the SARS-CoV-2 virus in our community. This is one of many methods we're using to help you understand the risk level in your community, so you can make informed personal decisions.
