
COVID-19 Surveillance in Wastewater at Suffolk County Sewage Treatment Plants (STP)



- Current Trends at the County's Large/Regional STPs:
 - Bergen Point Substantial Decrease
 - Selden Moderate Increase

Note: STP categorization is determine by number of properties served. Large STPs serve over 6,000 properties.

- At our larger/regional STPs, virus levels have decreased at Bergen Point. Virus levels have increased at Selden. At our smaller/local STPs, virus levels have increased at Port Jefferson and Parkland. Virus levels have decreased at Riverhead, Twelve Pines, SUNY Stony Brook, and Northport. Virus levels are steady at Woodside.

 and the Wastewater Surveillance Network. We're working
 together to monitor the presence of the SARS-CoV-2 virus in
 our community. This is one of many methods we're using to
 help you understand the risk level in your community, so you
